Today – This area is used to present the textile programs – Sheep to Shawl, A New Coat for Anna, Quilting as well as the Then and Now Program. Displayed here are implements were used in the days of home spun before the days of mechanized tools. The four natural textiles - wool, linen, cotton, and silk – are presented to school groups and guests to the Inn. Standing large in this room is an 1834 barn loom that would be used to weave yarn into fabric.

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
